Margaret Bock Housing (MBH), while full, though many tenants move up and on, has a long-time resident looking forward to helping care for the building. And ECCF's tenants are accomplishing more because of the low-cost office and storage space they rent here at the ECCF.

The ECCF's new Chief Operating Officer is working to strengthen services to our neighbors in need, reaching out to the community in a variety of ways, and seeking creative new partnerships and collaboration.




With your help, in 2016, we assisted 325 families of almost 700 people with just over \$36,100 in direct payments to landlords, basic utilities, ID replacement, local bus tickets, and auto gas. In addition to this, we also provided counseling, referrals, and other supportive ministry to thousands of other individuals.

In 2017, the needs continue to be great. We receive about 1000 requests for assistance each month, but funds are exhausted before we can help everyone who is in need.

What's New? We now establish two call-in days per month instead of one. After each call-in day, initial phone interviews streamline the process of assistance. In addition, we are taking a few emergency walk-ins when funds are available. We have updated bus ticket and auto gas requests, and other information systems for easier use and better tracking. Our office hours are still between 10 AM and 4 PM Monday through Friday.

As a result of these changes, we receive fewer ultra-distressed calls, and it is easier to ascertain people's situations, what kind of help someone might need, and how we might be able to assist.





Recently, a distraught gentleman asked to speak with the HHM Program Manager. He had just arrived in town with his fiancé and her grade school-aged son. They had been promised they could stay with friends and pay half the rent while they found a place to make a home of their own. They were much less welcome than they had anticipated, but within a day, this caring gentleman had two part-time jobs. With his fiancé's SSDI, they had enough to help their friend with rent and save for a place of their own.

We helped him find food and to find their son medical care, a bed, and a school. We helped him go through a list of landlords, found a place for them, and worked with Salvation Army, St. Vincent de Paul, and Metro Catholic Outreach to coordinate assistance supplementing his wages enough to make their deposit and first month's rent. They will be out of their awkward situation soon, and are very grateful for the many kinds of encouragement and supportive ministry they received. "Your help is wonderful. This has made all the difference for us. Thank you so much."





With your support, in 2016, CompuPlace served 143 people with disabilities through just under 1900 hours of computer-related learning services. Many individuals here still develop basic academic skills such as reading, spelling, math, money and problem solving. Increasingly, individuals with a variety of abilities and disabilities are coming to CompuPlace to learn skills such as office software and job and information searching strategies.

If you know of groups, agencies, or projects that could use our computer lab on Mondays or Fridays, we have moved almost all CompuPlace sessions to Tuesdays through Thursdays. We look forward to collaborating in new ways.

With increased efforts at outreach and development as the ECCF's COO, Robin is relying on a few stellar volunteers to guide CompuPlace clients while they learn. Lois, CompuPlace's founder, teaches groups and Tuesday afternoon clients. Catherine teaches on Wednesday afternoons. Jean watches for news, events, and ideas. We still need help on Wednesday and Thursday mornings. If you enjoy helping people who are eager to learn, please contact us!

It is a great honor to bring caring community members, businesses, and the faithful together in service to our neighbors in need. Over 20,000 people in Linn County; 10%, live below poverty level. And about 7000 more, or 13%, live on incomes only slightly above it. For people with disabilities, needs are even more severe: 20% live below poverty level, and 25% slightly above it. Each and every person has a unique life story, and we can all help in many ways. Margaret Bock Housing – A Home on Third

Our mission is to provide humanitarian care and service with the surrounding neighborhood by providing low-income, affordable housing with independent living for single adults, men or women, and to seek local, state and federal funding.

An eight member volunteer Board of Directors meets monthly and is active between meetings as well. This is our 18th year as a 501(c)3 non-profit organization. Our facility has 35 rooms typically fully occupied for single adults with low incomes. Tenants pay only \$300-320 on a month-to-month lease that includes utilities. A deposit of one month's rent is required and applicants are screened.

Contributions to help cover costs for insurance, maintenance, utilities, tenant furnishings, building supplies, plus office expenses are always welcome and needed. Our wish list includes single beds, sheets, pillows, lamps, and end tables. We seek to replace our flooring and to accomplish a tuck-pointing upgrade for our building.

We will provide picnics at our building again this year. Watch for dates in 2017 and join us!

Some tenants stay at MBH for a few months and some stay for a year. Others, like John, stay for several years and make MBH their home. John likes to keep busy and will help with work around and in the building. He loves to ride his bike around town in his leisure time, and enjoys a satisfying rest afterwards. He's eager to help with springtime tasks.
