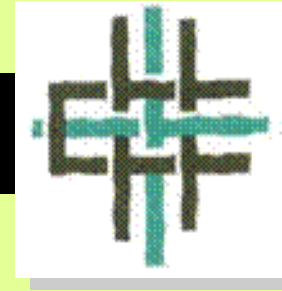

OFFICE SPACE FOR RENT

ECC has low-cost office space for rent! Below are the different areas of the building that are currently for rent. All shown prices include all utilities, and you will be able to utilize our DSL for a small monthly cost of \$20.00. Each space will be rented on a one year lease, and after that time will be on a month-to-month basis. We have a small parking lot behind the building and plenty of off-street parking. OFFICE SUITE... \$500 / month

Bathrooms located on same level. DSL available for additional fee (easy to setup). Down hallway, more secluded. Available immediately.

HELPING HANDS UPDATE...

Thanks to the support of local churches, individuals and small grants, Helping Hands Ministry (HHM) continues to provide limited financial assistance, referrals to other services and supportive care to those in need.

The population Helping Hands Ministry serves asks questions like these:

1. They turned off the water this morning. How can I get it turned back on?
2. What day this week will the sheriff come to empty the contents of my apartment onto the curb?
3. I have \$5.00 until payday. My baby needs formula and I need gas or bus fare to get to work this week. What am I going to do?
4. Thankfully we have food stamps, but how do I buy personal hygiene items, cleaning supplies and paper products?

There are folks in our community struggling with these and other concerns every day. Did you know that the average age of a homeless person in the US is 9? Cedar Rapids is not immune from this problem. Some children miss school because they don't have transportation to get there. Some adults are unable to get or keep jobs due to lack of transportation. All of these problems are happening right here in our area!

A role of HHM is to serve as an advocate for those in need. Work continues on having a Zero Poverty Symposium on Sunday afternoon, October 15. It will be at Kirkwood Training and Outreach Services (3375 Armar Drive NE, Cedar Rapids) from 1:30 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. This symposium will address two primary questions: What is poverty? What can be done in our community to end poverty?

DID YOU KNOW...?

Helping Hands assists an average of 70 households financially each month.

There are an average of 466 calls each month for assistance.

HHM averages 20-25 appointments per week and accommodates as many walk-in requests with 60% of the assistance budget going to help the homeless acquire housing or keep from losing it.

Another 33% of the budget utilized for utilities. The remaining funds are for transportation, food/non-food items and limited medical assistance.

HHM was able to disburse \$10,506 in the second quarter of 2006.

COMPUPLACE

CompuPlace provides abilities-based computer access and training to people with disabilities, primarily to Cedar Rapids area adults over age 21. About 60 individuals each month spend a total of around 175 hours working on basic reading, math and problem-solving skills, or use special assistive technology to work more efficiently with their disabilities. We have education that is fun, and fun that is educational. Here are some examples:

One gentleman has learned to check his email and do some web surfing with very little assistance. In doing this, he is working on reading skills, and is enjoying the wealth of information for lifelong learning on the internet. He like many other CompuPlace clients has often used a website called Wikipedia to learn about a topic of interest. His interests also include music sites and websites of local businesses. Occasionally he comes in with a specific website he has heard of instead of just a topic. He looks forward to coming to CompuPlace each week.

There is another gentleman who uses much more assistance. He checks his email weekly and receives an ecard each week from a long-time friend. He sends a card in reply, maintaining reading and spelling skills, and then works on a touch screen. He uses his finger to point to and choose puzzle pieces and drag them into place. He can also do a matching game with the touch screen without much help.

Dragon Naturally speaking is a program that allows computer users to operate the computer with voice commands. Several people with limited use of their hands have learned what this software can and cannot do for them. This program can be very helpful for someone who finds typing difficult. Intellitalk is a program that reads aloud what a person types as they are typing. This helps to build and reinforce spelling and reading skills, and can be an avenue of communication for someone, for instance with autism, who does not speak. Zoomtext is a program that enlarges or magnifies the computer screen and also reads aloud. This can be liberating for someone with low vision or other print disability. These are very expensive programs and it is important to "try before you buy" so that funds are not wasted.

The schedule is very full. With more than 20 staff hours per week, more people could be served. Operational funds are the most difficult to find. Thanks to The Ecumenical Community Center Foundation and its member churches, individual donors, a Community Development Block Grant, Christ Episcopal Church's Bruna Fund and the Wal-Mart Foundation's Literacy Grant.
