#### **Letter From the President**

We've moved! The Ecumenical Community Center is open for business at its new location at 601 Second Avenue SE. Like many events in life, this move, much anticipated, passed in a blur of activity. Our new location is closer to downtown yet only 5 blocks from our previous address. We have beautiful, efficient office space for Helping Hands Ministry and Compu-Place. Most of the previous tenants at 1035 Third Avenue SE chose to move with us and are also enjoying remodeled office space and all new office furniture.

The Ecumenical Center also acquired the adjacent space at 605 Second Avenue SE and has leased the space to the Green Square Meals program for \$1.00 a year. Green Square Meals now has a new kitchen, expanded dining room facilities and an enclosed waiting area for persons seeking an evening meal. Bus service is available to the new facility, which is only two blocks from the original Green Square Meal site. In addition, the Witwer Senior Center, flooded out of its former location last summer, is sharing the facility with Green Square Meals. Both programs are up and running and preparing over 600 meals daily during the week. The Ecumenical Community Center is pleased to be able to provide space to two programs so very important to the Cedar Rapids community.

Many people have made this move possible. Lois Rude of Helping Hands Ministry and Robin Brunner of CompuPlace have worked hard to ensure a smooth transition for their programs during the relocation. My thanks to the ECC Board members for their guidance. I also want to thank Scott Olson for his vision and patience in making the new location a reality. My thanks to Peter Riley and Dean Spina for shepherding us through the legal process associated with the move. My special thanks to Chuck Scott, Board member extraordinaire, for the countless hours he has provided to the ECC - Chuck continues to be a mainstay of the organization. Last, I thank all of you who have supported the ECC programs and the relocation to our new facility. We will be hosting a 'grand opening' celebration in March 29th from 1:30-3:00 p.m. I look forward to seeing you all then. Until then, thank you all for sharing God's blessings so freely.



#### **Margaret Bock Housing Update**

## "A Home on Third" 1021 Third Avenue SE, Cedar Rapids, Iowa 52403

Margaret Bock Housing (MBH) continues to serve low income single adults with affordable housing. It is currently at full capacity with a waiting list for acceptance. Thirty-four (34) single rooms are available to be occupied. Six of the rooms have an adjoining bathroom where as the remaining 28 share one of several community bathrooms. Rent varies according to the size of the room from \$235 to \$255 per month including utilities and cleaning of all common areas.

The minimum requirements for acceptance are: must be single, have a source of income, pay a \$100 security deposit, pay one month rent in advance and agree to a "criminal check". Rent applications may be picked up at the Helping Hands Ministry office located at 601 Second Avenue SE #2. Raymond Pina is the MBH Property Manager. His hours are: 8 am - Noon, Monday through Friday. **Wish list:** twin sheets & pillows
