Helping Hands Ministry (HHM) is the recipient of two grants to help households with first month rent. **The City of Marion granted \$36,260** to be used for 1st mo rent to Marion residents who were experiencing difficulty moving into a new place. Due to limited income, they could pay either the deposit or the rent, but not both. When approved, the household pays the deposit and the grant pays the rent. During the last 17 months, a total of <u>33 households</u> representing <u>72 persons</u> <u>have been assisted</u> at a cost of \$12,647.77 leaving \$23,612.23 to be allocated through 2009. As word has spread about this grant, more people are contacting HHM. This grant is only to be used for rent. The income guideline is less than 133% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.

The **Housing Fund for Linn County** provided a \$32,500 grant to be used in 2009 for either 1st month rent, rent deposit, one month's rent to avoid eviction or utility deposit to residents of Linn County. Applicants' income must fall within the 30% Area Median Income as determined by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. They must pay their own deposit, have a steady source of income/support for the last three months, and show that they will be able to continue paying for ongoing rent afterwards. A budget counseling session with Horizon's Consumer Credit Counseling is mandatory. As of the middle of May, <u>34 households</u> representing <u>70 persons have been assisted</u> at a cost of \$14,505 with \$17,995 remaining. A grant application for a second year of funding will be submitted in June. This grant was used for one utility deposit, three rent to avoid evictions and thirty first month rents in Lisbon, Central City, Marion and Cedar Rapids. *We are very thankful for these two grants that have been a tremendous help to 67 households representing 142 persons!*

HHM has a mission to provide material assistance, referrals, and/or supportive ministry to persons in emergency need in collaboration with faith communities and local agencies in Linn County. It provides caring support to people in emergency need and preserves dignity by helping them manage their own lives. They are Linn County residents with incomes that fall below 100% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines. Through April of 2009, 285 households representing 580 persons have been assisted with rent, utility, security/utility deposits, and miscellaneous items such as birth certificates, photo identifications and limited transportation. This is made possible by the generosity of the Linn County faith community, private donations and grants.

MBH continues to function very well with a nine member volunteer board of directors. Our board meets monthly and is very active between meetings as well. This is our tenth year as a 501(c)3 non-profit corporation! Our mission is to provide humanitarian care and service with the surrounding neighborhoods by providing low income housing, and to seek local, state, and federal funding in support of this mission. Our facility has 34 rooms for single adult men or women with low incomes. Tenants pay \$225 - \$240 per month including utilities. A deposit of \$100 is required and applicants are screened for any criminal record within the State of Iowa. All the social service agencies in Cedar Rapids know about our facility. Contributions for day-to-day operations to help cover mortgage payments, property insurance, utilities, property manager Ray Pina's salary and other expenses are always welcome and needed since no grants provide this help.

We have settled into the lab and office with relative ease, though there is still work to do. A garden of older resources and papers still needs to be weeded and manicured. Two older Macs have yet to be set up. There is a need for one or two more big TouchScreens.

One very popular game right now is an old one, Fisher-Price Barnyard Rhythm and Moos. It is a musical click and explore game that works with a Touch Screen. If anyone has an extra copy of this "out of print" CD, we could put it to good use. If you know of any game authors who could help us write similar games, perhaps involving household pets, ocean animals, zoo animals, or wild Iowa critters, please contact CompuPlace.

Other current favorites are typing games. The best programs are ones that will not proceed with a mistaken keystroke. Nothing happens until you type just the right letter. We have discovered a way to type over a PowerPoint slide during the slide show presentation and hope to make in-house literacy materials in this way. Disk Cleanup, Disk Defragmenter, AntiVirus, AntiSpyware, and CCleaner all need to be run and checked at regular intervals. This helps to keep the computers healthy and cooperative. Thanks to the REACT center and a dedicated volunteer, the CD drive was soon replaced, and a new backup copy of the CD was made.

Don't let your AntiVirus Expire!

Too many people ignore the irritating little box that pops up telling them that the AntiVirus program that came with their computer is about to expire. Don't let this happen to you. MAKE TIME to install a REPUTABLE FREE AntiVirus program. At CompuPlace, we use AVG Free, and have heard the Avast is also good. Be sure you USE what you have.

Learn to Do Disk Cleanup Regularly!

Like the bottom of the silverware drawer, messy, unneeded crumbs should be cleaned from your computer periodically. CCleaner is also used at CompuPlace and can be downloaded and run quite easily. It IS possible to remove something from your computer that you wanted. If you don't feel comfortable, get some advice from someone you trust. But DO learn to do it yourself if you can. It's not so scary after a few successful run-throughs.

Get an AntiSpyware program too!

Spybot Search & Destroy is nice because you can immunize against known harmful websites. It should NOT run a scan at the same time as your antivirus software is running a scan. They fight.
